Welcome to 2018 and we are delighted that it is the year of lifelong learning. Neighbourhood Houses are at the forefront of this important learning environment.

"Neighbourhood houses and community education centres are highly conducive for adult learners nervous about the prospect of returning to education. The flexibility of the learning environment, the non-hierarchical relationships between tutors and students, the use of small group work and individualised programs as well as the established practice of learning and social support are ideal conditions for second chance learners." (Dr. Ollis 2017 Deakin University)

"If you're someone who had negative experiences of school or someone who has been away from it for a long time, the prospect of returning to some kind of retraining can be overwhelming," (Dr Ollis 2017)

'Allan', a former aircraft mechanic, agrees with this growing body of evidence. When he was retrenched after 37 years as an aircraft mechanic, the 54 year old was daunted by the prospect of retraining for a new job. He'd left school at 17 to take up an apprenticeship and regardehimself

as a 'hands-on' rather than an academic learner. He was worried he'd be lost in the large classes at a TAFE college or university.

For 'Allan', the relaxed and supportive environment of his local neighbourhood house allowed him to flourish. He retrained as a youth worker, is now working full time and furthering his formal qualifications at TAFE.

"Neighbourhood houses and community learning centres are well-established and important spaces of social inclusion, connection, health and wellbeing and for learning throughout life," says Dr Ollis.

The UNESCO Global Report on Adult Learning and Education (2016) supports this research and highlights the contribution that it makes across many sectors of society, and described it as:

- an indispensable component of education, and a fundamental and enabling human right
- an integral dimension of a balanced life course
- part of a holistic, inter-sectoral sustainable development agenda with the potential to offer multiple benefits and lasting impact.

So 2018 is the year that highlights the connection, learning, social inclusion and the wonderful benefits of your Neighbourhood House! Come on in!

Drawings: A journey from Pakistan to Australia.




I am Mustafa Noori, 23, and I'm from Afghanistan. I lived as a refugee in Pakistan since I was 10 until my dreams were answered when my family and I, consisting of my mother and other 4 brothers, came to Australia in 2017. I finished my year 12 in Pakistan and could not continue my education due to the difficulties we faced as refugees.

At the age of 7, I started to draw different things; from trees to animals, from people's faces to nature, and so on. At the beginning I tried to hide from my family and friends that I draw, but after a few years passed I was encouraged by people to draw professionally. This was a dream that I never believed I could make real. This is because, I used to work tirelessly after school to help my family financially and I never could dream of having basic materials to paint properly. I used to collect recyclable rubbish to use for my painting because I was not able to afford to buy painting materials. But everything changed when, after ten years, my father could sponsor us to join him in Australia.

I want to continue my drawing and education here in Australia, because I believe that this land is the land of possible

Financial Counselling Help

Family Mediation and Counselling Victoria (FMC) have employed a financial counsellor to work out of the Uniting-Care office, on Torquay Rd Grovedale three days a week Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. This service complements the Financial Counselling service that FMC is currently running two days a week on Monday's and Wednesday's out of the CatholicCare offices in Mc Killop St. Financial counsellors can help with:

- Developing a clear picture of your overall financial situation
- Explaining your options in relation to your financial position and explain the different benefits and disadvantages of the options
- Advocating or negotiating with creditors, government agencies and others on your behalf
- Being an ear to talk to and help to provide you with the support you need
- Dealing with bankruptcy or repossession
- Understanding Debt and managing it

Grovedale Community Garden

A small group of Grovedale residents came together in 1983 with a common interest in gardening. By February 1984 a committee was formed and by April of that year, after much hard work, Grovedale Community Garden was established.

Long-time residents of Grovedale may remember the Garden has been established on the old Geelong radio station's 3GL site. There was a small building and a tower, surrounded by yellow granetic sand and gravel, which can still be found if we dig deep enough!

We are very grateful for those original 14 people who did the groundwork that the present members are now benefiting from

Community gardening has become very popular in recent times in part due to smaller house plots and a rising interest in the health (nutritional, physical and mental) aspects of gardening.

Gardening provides fresh, organic, produce & exercise for our bodies and a sense of mental well-being. Having hands and feet in the earth diffuses stress and anxiety and produces a calmness. Everything else is forgotten about and a sense of Zen descends. Well, except when the seedlings you havn grown from seed you collected last season have all been devoured overnight by some slimy creatures! Yet, slimy

creatures have to live too and after all are only doing what comes naturally to ... slimy creatures. Gardeners are quite philosophical.

The diverse background and experience of our members means we all have our own way of doing things and we learn from each other. It is educational to newbie & long time gardeners to see how others prepare the soil, plant various seeds & seedlings and propagate. Everyone has their own way and we all learn from each other. Along with ideas and methods, we swap and share excess produce and recipes.

The Grovedale Community Garden is a vibrant community. Members look out for each other, helping out with members' plots if they are away on holiday or ill and if not seen for a while, checking in on them to see if they are ok.

Members are responsible for maintaining their plots and participating in regular seasonal working bees to help with maintenance and generally sprucing up the common areas. These are also social events where we have a well earned BBQ lunch and good old natter.

Children participate in a carefully planned and sequential program. As well as introducing musical concepts such as beat, rhythm, dynamics, form and notation, our program develops the whole child by encouraging children's speech development, listening skills, social skills and physical skills.




