Our partnership with the Grovedale/Waurn Ponds Lions Club started during the 100 years of Lions community service celebrations. David Ridley approached GNH to make an application for the 100 years of Lions grant, and the rest as they say is history.

The Lions raised over \$7000 for the BBQ as they were committed to providing a space where community members could gather and where the youth drop in, the Aboriginal boys cultural program and the Senior Citizens and all the other groups at the Neighbourhood House could come together and have a feed and a chat. A perfect tool for community engagement and connection!

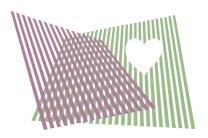

Wins for Grovedale in Council budget

ouncil's 2018-19 Budget was officially adopted at our meeting on 26 June, and we're pleased to say it contained some good news for clubs and groups in the Grovedale area.

Grovedale Football and Netball Club plays an important role in the local community, and with more than 500 participants, has now outgrown its change facilities at Burdoo Reserve.

We've applied to the state government for a \$100,000 grant under the Country Football and Netball Funding Program, to be put towards a major changeroom upgrade at the reserve.

We've also set aside \$260,000 in our own budget, which we'll contribute to the project if the grant application is successful. With a rapidly growing base of female footballers, this upgrade is much needed and would bring enormous community benefit.

The Grovedale Men's Shed is another organisation to receive assistance from the budget. At the moment the group meets at Club Armstrong in Armstrong Creek, but is looking to expand and would like to find a larger facility in the Grovedale area. We've included \$50,000 to investigate and plan for a suitable site. This group is also vital for our local community.



It offers men a space to work on projects they're interested in, but more importantly, to develop new friendships and discuss their issues. In a world where mental health is an increasing concern, the value of a safe and comfortable environment such as this can't be underestimated.

Finally, we recently attended the sod turning for phase two of the Barwarre Gardens retirement village in Marshall. Developed by GenU – a not-for-profit organisation based in Geelong – the village provides a safe and inclusive community for local retirees. Our thanks to GenU for their investment in Greater Geelong.

Community Food and Sustainability

ransition South Barwon have been successful in an application for a City of Greater Geelong Environment and Sustainability Grant.

In partnership with Grovedale Neighbourhood House, Grovedale Community Orchard, Grovedale Community Garden and Grovedale Children's Services we are very excited to be hosting "Grow it, Eat it: A Celebration of Local Community Food" from mid October until early Novem-

This celebration will encourage and inspire community members to get involved with growing, cooking and eating food from our gardens, nature strips and community spaces. All events will be free of cost including a preserv-

ing workshop, a cooking class, a movie night and numerous gardening workshops.

A highlight will be the talk from permaculture co-originator David Holmgren who will delve into ideas from his recently released book Retrosuburbia: a downshifters guide to a resilient future. David is in high demand presently as a speaker and we are very fortunate to be able to

bring him to Grovedale to share his ideas and enthusiasm around community food. Keep an eye out in future editions of the Grovedale Grapevine for more details closer to the date.

A committed group of volunteers continues to work at the Grovedale Community Orchard. You are always welcome to join us (no experience necessary), on the first Saturday of each month at 9.30am in Perrett Street. We undertake a range of seasonal tasks including planting, pruning, watering, weeding and of course harvesting fruit.



The working bee is always followed by morning tea. We have recently completed a central spiral labyrinth and some large mosaic pavers featuring water, sun, earth and wind which have given some more structure to the space. Many of our trees are deciduous and starting to lose their leaves in preparation for winter and we are looking forward to some much needed rain.

The orchard working group have also been very fortunate to receive a Community Sponsorship Grant from Geelong Connected Communities. This grant will cover our council land lease, water rates and public liability insurance for a year allowing our volunteers to focus their efforts on the orchard instead of fundraising to pay these expenses. The application process was quite simple and may be useful for other local groups to consider. You can find more information at www.geelongconnectedcommunities.com.

The monthly foodswap has moved to the Grovedale Community Gardens with a wider variety of local fresh produce, cups of tea and even cake! We encourage you to come along on the 3rd Saturday of the month 9.30 - 10.30 to check it out. Any amount (even small) of homegrown produce, homemade products or seeds/seedlings can be swapped. If you don't have anything you are still welcome to come along and make a small donation in exchange for some great local produce, or just come for a cuppa and a chat. It's also a lovely chance to check out the wonderful community gardens and perhaps even learn a thing or two!

You want world peace? Play the ukulele!

oss Hobbs' passion is the ukulele. Over the last three years, he has been teaching ukulele classes at Grovedale Neighbourhood House. The groups ages range from 90 years of age to one as young as eight years old, who comes along with his mother and grandmother.

Ross Hobbs describes the ukulele as a unique instrument that anyone can learn to play. It's an easily accessible instrument that easily lends itself to group classes. He stresses the importance of music in keeping the brain alert and functioning at its optimum capacity. The classes have also helped people in the group build connections with other students and Ross encourages the importance of community interaction.

When asked the reason behind why most people sign up for the classes, Ross replies that a lot of people want the companionship of being in a group that shares a common interest.

And how did this all start, you ask? The history behind Ross' beginnings in teaching the ukulele began within his own family where he is one of nine children. The siblings banded together to form their own ukulele group not only to learn how to play the instrument, but to come together as a family.

This prompted Ross onto bigger dreams of offering the



opportunity to learn the ukulele in a group setting to those who didn't have the luxury of being part of a big family as well as to form a connection to the Grovedale community.

And what began as 15 people attending the first ukulele class 3 years ago, has now grown to 120 members in total (thankfully not all in the one class at the one time).

Ross encourages anyone interested to come and try a class. Classes are run every Monday from 6.30pm - 7.30pm (beginners) and 7.30pm - 9pm (free for all).

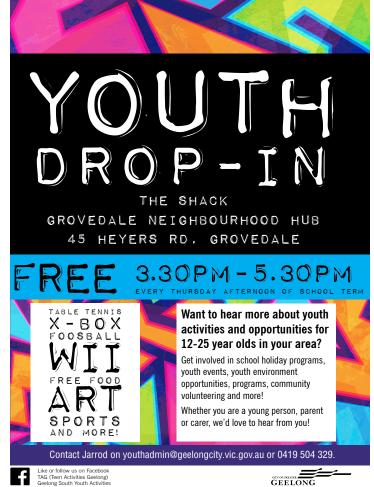

Children's Acknowledgement to Country

We at Grovedale Child and Family Centre would like to say tthank you to the Wadawurrung people of the Kulin nation for letting us share your land. We promise to look after it, the ani-

mals and people too. Hello land (all touch the land) Hello sky (arms up to sky) Hello me (hug self) Hello friends (open arms).

As part of reconciliation week the children made bush tucker.



They watched a video of children gathering food and discussing what is good to eat and what is not good to eat. They cooked and ate wattleseed damper and Rice with warrigal greens.

The children painted their hands at the easels in the colours of the aboriginal flag: Yellow for the sun. Black for the aboriginal people, Red for the red ochre used in cere-

monies representing spiritual connection to the land.

Becoming aware of the symbols of aboriginal culture, children develop understanding that all have a right to belong. As a teaching team we are educating ourselves about aboriginal culture and histoy. We are making connections with the Wathaurong community to support us in developing our knowledge and practices with children.

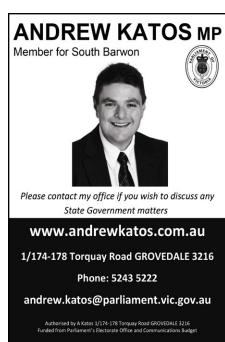

Did you know winter is the busiest time of year for house

Using heating to dry clothes is common during winter. Keep clothing a safe distance from heaters and always clean the lint filters in clothes dryers. Always turn off electrical appliances that are not being used and avoid placing weighty objects on beds with electric blankets.

If you are heading away for a break, make sure to turn off power to electrical appliances and let a neighbour know vou are away.

Smoke alarms more than 10 years old should be replaced as they may become unreliable. CFA recommends photo-electric smoke alarms powered by a 10 year lithium battery. When installed and maintained



correctly these smoke alarms detect smoke the quickest, alerting you earlier and giving you more time to evacuate

Also take care when cooking, as this is the single largest cause of fire in the home.

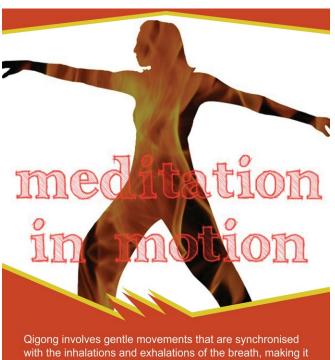
