Well done to Linda and the Grovedale Neighbourhood House team for putting this excellent publication together. We appreciate the chance to provide an update on some local council projects.

MARSHALL PRECINCT STRUCTURE PLAN

Community members have until 4 October to have your say on the draft Marshall Precinct Structure Plan.

The Marshall precinct is the northernmost part of the Armstrong Creek growth area. It's directly across the railway line from Grovedale, including Marshall Station and extending across to Barwon Heads Road.

Based on the draft plan, this area will have the ability to house around 4300 residents.

It's been developed to maximise access to the station by putting medium and high density housing within walking distance.

It also features a series of shared paths and well protected environmental features.

We stress that this plan is in draft stage at the moment and we're keen to find out what the community thinks. The feedback will be considered by the council in coming up with a final version.

SPORTING CLUB UPGRADES

Burdoo Reserve and Grovedale Recreation Reserve are both getting changeroom upgrades.

The growth of female sporting participation has been huge in recent years, and both sets of new changerooms will be female friendly. It will give the Grovedale football, netball and cricket clubs (Burdoo Reserve) and Barwon Soccer Club (Grovedale Recreation Reserve) the ability to fit all of their players in, with comfortable and modern facilities

Both projects are being funded in a partnership between the council, the state government and the tenant clubs. We're looking forward to seeing work at both venues getting started.

Finally, anyone who enjoys an early morning swim will be happy to know that Leisurelink now opens at 5.30am Monday to Friday – half an hour earlier than the old 6am opening timeWe allocated funding in this year's council budget to make this happen after feedback from the community.
