Celebrating the Inspiring Artwork of Wadawurrung Traditional Owner BJ O'Toole

NAIDOC Week is a celebration of the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It is held annually in Australia on the first full week of July.

In celebration of NAIDOC Week 2023,
Grovedale Neighbourhood House would like
to share and celebrate the work of local artist
and Wadawurrung man Billy-Jay (BJ) O'Toole.
The work on the cover of this edition of the
Grapevine is titled 'Barwon Neighbourhood
Houses' and was commissioned by the
Neighbourhood Houses Barwon Network of
which Grovedale Neighbourhood House is a
member. This beautiful artwork captures the
essence of Neighbourhood Houses Barwon and
their Reconciliation journey together with the 24
Neighbourhood Houses in the Barwon region and
the communities they serve.

The artwork description below tells the story of this journey.

Everyday the sunrises to bring us a new day. Bunjil (wedge tailed eagle) the creator of Wadawurrung country soars high in the sky, watching over Country, waters and people. Waa (The crow) is the protector.

The U shapes represent the 24 Barwon neighbourhood houses that are located across Wadawurrung and Eastern Marr Country the U shape symbolises sitting down. Community houses are the heart of suburbs a place to gather, provide services and information for all living in the community, The Eucalypt leaves are a sign of Welcoming used in Traditional ceremonies to cleans and provide a safe space and passage on Country

The hand in the middle symbolises everyone's commitment to Reconciliation, it takes many hands to come together.

The track markings are of kangaroos and emus that once were of plenty across Country.


Water gives life to country and all of us. Our sea Country, River Country and wetlands are home to abundance of species that roam across Wadawurrung and Eastern Marr Country.



BJ aims to educate people about his culture and love for land through his art. BJ grew up in Geelong on Wadawurrung Country, an area that stretches from the Great Dividing Range in Victoria's north all the way to the south coast, covering the land between Aireys Inlet in the west to the Werribee River in the east.

At the age of 23 he graduated with a Certificate IV in Aboriginal Cultural Heritage management and has managed and protected cultural heritage sites on Wadawurrung Country working for Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation. Working on country everyday ignited his passion for art. Through his business Papul Art, BJ enjoys creating collaborative commissioned works - recent projects include interpretative signage that tells the story of falling waters at Lal Lal Reservoir (Central Highlands Water and Barwon Water), designing a playground in Ocean Grove, tops for the Torquay Tornadoes Hockey Club and footy boot artwork for Geelong Cats' star Tom Hawkins for the second Indigenous round.

GEELONG COUNCIL: LIBRARIES SECURED, GOLF COURSE REOPENS, AND COMMUNITY PROJECTS THRIVE

Firstly, let's address the issues of much discussion in the community.

Funding for our libraries remains a priority and the councillors are very confident we will find a budget process that keeps the libraries operating at their optimum.

While there has been considerable community angst, your local councillors remain steadfastly committed to funding our libraries.

The Queens Park Golf Course, driving range and pro shop are expected to reopen to green fee payers this week.

This is a result of your local councillors demanding that this course remain open to all, without compromise to services.

Council's significant investment in the Kardinia Ward is continuing, and it is fantastic to see many projects coming to fruition.

The Armstrong Creek West Community Hub opened in March and is due to have its first kindergarten classes starting in term three.

Meanwhile, work on the \$21.86 million Biyal-A Armstrong Creek Library is progressing well, and the state-of-the-art building is scheduled to be completed in mid-2024.

The much-loved Waurn Ponds Skate Park is close to being upgraded, and will become one of our premier youth skate and play sites.

The \$1.95 million redevelopment will create a space suitable for various wheeled sports, ages, and skill levels.

In other news, Council has announced the recipients of grants in the second round of the 2022-23 Community Grants program.

A number of organisations in the Kardinia Ward will benefit from the Environmental Sustainability and Healthy & Connected Communities grants.

Mount Duneed's Foundation 61 will receive \$10,000 towards solar panels, while the Belmont Lions Sports Club were allocated \$1,862 for sporting equipment.

Applications for this year's grants opened in June, and there is more than \$3.9 million available to assist community groups and organisations.

CITY OF GREATER GEELONG COMMUNITY GRANTS NOW OPEN

Does your community group have a great idea for a community project that needs some financial support to make it a reality? The City of Greater Geelong Community Grants are now open with more than \$3.9 million available to assist the community, arts, events, cultural, sporting, recreation, heritage, and environmental sustainability sectors.

Distributed across 13 different grant streams, funding ranges from small grants of \$500 to assist grassroots activities, through to \$350,000 to help shovel-ready community infrastructure projects.

Community grants opportunities and key dates

Opening on 3 June 2023 - closing on 24 July 2023

- Arts Projects (up to \$10,000)
 To help deliver arts and cultural projects for those working in all art forms.
- Community Events (up to \$10,000)
 To support moderate-sized public events that provide economic and community benefits.
- Environmental Sustainability (up to \$10,000) To support projects that enhance our natural environment and drive environmental sustainability, as well as small environmental capital works up to \$10,000 and equipment grants up to \$2,000.
- Healthy & Connected Communities (up to \$10,000)

To help projects that will improve the health, wellbeing and capacity of our community. Also includes equipment grants up to \$2,000.

Climate Change Partnership – (up to \$50,000)
 Partnership Grants for community led projects and activities to support the greater Geelong community to achieve net zero community emissions and increase resilience to the impact of climate change.

Geelong Children's Week – up to \$500
 Grants for not-for-profit community groups to run activities and events during Children's Week held annually in October.

- Community Infrastructure. Grants for not-for-profit community groups for the planning and delivery of infrastructure projects.
 - Planning (up to \$50,000): Costs associated with facility development planning, concept designs and detailed designs for future infrastructure projects that demonstrate strong community benefit
 - Capital Works (up to \$350,000): To assist with cost of ready to go community infrastructure projects. Infrastructure projects must be openly accessible to and have strong community benefits.

 - Planning (Up to 100% of eligible project costs with a maximum of \$10,000): Feasibility and investigation projects to provide technical, planning, and project scoping advice for future restoration projects

EXPERIENCE THE TIMELESS BEAUTY OF SOGETSU IKEBANA

When the Sogetsu Ikebana group meets on Thursday evenings, from 6:00 pm to 8:00pm, the students include four members who have been attending classes for almost 19 years. This longevity does not mean we are slow learners or that the course takes so long to complete. No, it is because we still get so much out of attending classes and practising this ancient form of Japanese flower arranging.

From the moment we arrive with our bucket of flowers and branches, vases and secateurs, we know we are among friends. After the preliminary chatter, we start

work on whatever our exercise is for that night and a wonderful calm settles in. For about 90 minutes the outside world fades out of view. There is no competition, we share material, lend a hand when we can, and at the end we look up to see what the rest of the group has created and what we can learn from each other's efforts. There might be students working at three or four different levels, and we will all have received advice and assistance from our teacher, Christopher James. When we go home we do so with the satisfaction of having created something beautiful and learned something new.

Prospective students should know that they do not need any floristry experience, artistic talent or special equipment. All they need for their first lesson is a container, a pair of secateurs and floral material. The first sections of the curriculum will cover the basic rules and variations of those arrangements. Sogetsu

and variations of those arrangements. Sogetsu Ikebana is one of several schools of this ancient practice, but it is a modern, sculptural form, and once the basic skills are acquired, you get do freestyle exercises or learn how to focus on colour, straight or curved lines, using leaves only, working with fruit or vegetables, and a range of other approaches.

It is fair to say that budding ikebana practitioners will soon view western flower arrangements very differently. They will also find themselves collecting stuff and allowing it take over their home. They will be looking at all kinds of things they might one day use as a vase or checking the side of the road for interesting branches. There is a reason for Christopher's blog's name being Roadside Ikebana. Eventually it is also possible to become involved with the Melbourne branch of Sogetsu School of Ikebana or participate in exhibitions. Members of our class have, for example, contributed to exhibitions at Geelong's Wintergarden and Qdos Gallery in Lorne, as well as a number of Melbourne venues.

5 WAYS TOY LIBRARIES CAN HELP FAMILIES

As a hub for families to share resources, connect with one another, and foster a sense of belonging, Grovedale Toy Library is more than just a place to borrow toys—it's a vibrant community center.

Community Connection: Toy libraries serve as a community hub where families can come together to share resources and connect with one another. The Grovedale Toy Library hosts Stay and Play events every term for their member families. On May 27th, we held a World Play Day event celebrating all things sustainable, and we have a Musical Stay and Play coming up on June 24th. We also have a special School Holiday Games Day coming up, which will be open to nonmembers.

Cost of Living Relief: Toy libraries provide a costeffective solution for families by eliminating the need to constantly buy new toys, games, and puzzles for their children. Our members save an average of \$3,400 a year by being a part of Grovedale Toy Library!

Sustainable Play: Toy libraries promote sustainability by reducing the amount of waste generated from discarded or unused toys. Over half (51%) of the toys

bought in Australia end up in landfill within a year. Increased utilization of toy libraries could significantly reduce this.

Toy Rotation: Toy libraries offer a wide variety of toys that children can borrow and play with, which helps stimulate their creativity and imagination. On average, a child gets bored of a toy within 36 days, making toy rotation so important to stimulate children's minds!

Support Development: Toy libraries can provide educational toys that promote learning and development in children, which can be especially beneficial for families with limited access to educational resources. We have a very popular range of Story Sacks with toys accompanying classic children's books, and a large range of STEM toys, including a variety of coding toys! The library is about to expand our Medical Toys range thanks to a generous grant from Geelong Community Foundation, giving our member families simple and effective tools to help improve their children's health literacy.
